Hurricane Irma - Haiti was Spared, Our Staff Prepared



As many of our volunteers know, it doesn't take a Category 5 storm to cause great damage to Cap Haitien, an already low-lying city with poor infrastructure and few resources, and Cap Haitien and Haiti seem to fall victim to natural disaster after natural disaster. But what might be lacking in formal resources is made up for in the spirit and resilience of the Haitian people and, we are enormously proud to say, the leadership and planning of the Hands Up for Haiti in country staff.

With Hurricane Irma barreling down the Caribbean with Haiti in its sights, our people on the ground went into action

to ensure the safety of our staff and their families, secure our own program sites, alert people, and ready medications and supplies to help as needed.

Dr Manol Isac, in-country Executive Director, outlined a plan which included creating a WhatsApp group for employees, identifying evacuation locations for staff and community members, putting in place food and water supplies, and preparing medical and wound supplies for the aftermath. The survival kits had soap, gloves, masks, chlorox, bandages, tape, gauze and headlights. They also prepared rice in case food supplies ran low. In addition, staff went to the communities of Shada, Bois de Lance, and Bas Limbe to warn people of the coming storm and to helped with storm preparations.

HUFH2nd Annual In-Country Congress



This year at our annual strategic planning meeting, HUFH's leadership explored our vision for the future. The answer: strategic programming with targeted impact directed at those with little or no access to quality care, all led by Haitian medical and lay staff who know their communities and their needs best, and how best to serve those needs. Malnutrition, hypertension, cervical cancer and ophthalmologic programs to name a few, all run by Haitian doctors and nurses, in turn assisted by community health workers chosen from the communities that we serve, who, using a holistic approach to care, can help decrease barriers to success.

Late in August, our in-country team led by Dr. Manol Isac, in-country Executive Director, assembled for the 2nd annual Congress of our staff and invited guests. The title for the program: **"Together as one for a strong HUFH In Country, Yes We Can!"** Participants successfully shared their ideas about what HUFH does well, what needs to be improved, and how best to move forward to ensure strategic impact. Workshops were held for each program group to evaluate individual programs, identify the successes and challenges faced during the year and to create a roadmap for the coming year to ensure that our programs positive and impactful. As Dr. Manol stated: "So many questions and good suggestions...It was so amazing."

Sustainability in action: Clearly they can!

And the continuing role of the HUFH organization? Education. Education for staff, education for patients, education for the community. Visiting teams focusing on mentorship and capacity building of local leaders and programs, an emphasis that we believe is essential to the development of a sustainable health care system in Haiti, one with a positive, targeted and dramatic impact.
